### NOTICE OF FILING AND PUBLIC HEARING

D.P.U. 17-107

July 25, 2017

Petition of Milford Water Company, pursuant to G.L. c. 164, §94, and G.L. c. 165, §2, for Approval of a General Rate Increase as set forth in M.D.P.U. No. 23 and M.D.P.U. No. 24.

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On June 15, 2017, Milford Water Company (“MWC” or “Company”) filed a petition with the Department of Public Utilities (“Department”) for a general rate increase of \$1,895,773, which represents an overall increase of 29.6 percent over the Company’s currently effective rates. MWC last received a general rate increase in 2013. See Milford Water Company, D.P.U. 12-86 (2013). The Department has docketed this matter as D.P.U. 17-107 and has suspended the effective date of the proposed rate increase until May 1, 2018, to investigate the propriety of the Company’s request.

If the Company’s petition is approved as presented, a typical residential customer in Milford using 2,000 cubic feet per quarter would receive an increase of approximately \$34.35 per quarter, or 29.6 percent. Bill impacts will vary based on customer class and volume used. Individual customers may contact the Company as shown below for specific bill impact information. Additionally, the Company proposes to revise its tariffs to allow the Company to bill customers on either a monthly or quarterly basis.

The Department will conduct a public hearing to receive comments on the Company’s petition. The hearing will take place on: **Tuesday, September 5, 2017 at 7:00 p.m.** at the Milford Town Hall, 52 Main Street, Milford, Massachusetts 01757. Any person interested in commenting on this matter may appear at the public hearing or file written comments with the Department not later than the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on **Friday, September 8, 2017**.

Reasonable accommodations at public or evidentiary hearings for people with disabilities are available upon request. Any person who desires to participate in the evidentiary phase of this proceeding must file a written petition for leave to intervene or to participate in the proceeding no later than the close of business (5:00 p.m.) on **Friday, August 25, 2017**. A petition filed late may be disallowed as untimely, unless good cause is shown for waiver under 220 C.M.R. § 1.01(4). To be allowed, a petition under 220 C.M.R. § 1.03(1) must satisfy the standing requirements of G.L. c. 30A, § 10.
